Attendance and Punctuality:

As a school, we are working with the Local Authority to improve our overall attendance. You will need to provide evidence for illnesses longer than three days. A reminder, that holidays taken during term time will not be authorised by the school. Unauthorised absence may result in a Fixed Penalty Notice, being issued by the Borough of Waltham Forest. The local Authority will be looking into absences that are taken in the lead up to the holidays and the week we return. We also inform the Local Authority of any persistent absence below 90%.

Any parents who receive a letter from the school, the Local Authority will be sending you a Notification of Parental Responsibility (NPR).

Collection of your child: We understand that from time to time you may not be able to collect your child yourself and may nominate another person to do so. It is vital that you phone the office to let them know if someone else (who is not on the Child Collection Form) will be collecting that day.

Under our Safeguarding procedures, teaching staff have strict instructions not to let children go with anyone who is not on the Child Collection Form. If someone comes to collect and we have not been informed, your child cannot be released until the teaching staff have dismissed all children and asked the office to call you as the parent or carer to establish whether that person is allowed to collect. This can take time and be inconvenient for all involved therefore we ask you to let us know about any changes before the end of the school day. Many thanks for your cooperation.

The Gospel for Sunday 21st April 2024 1 THE GOOD SHEPHERD

Jesus said, "I am the good shepherd: the good shepherd is one who lays down his life for his sheep. The hired man, since he is not the shepherd and the sheep do not belong to him, abandons the sheep and runs away as soon as he sees a wolf coming, and then the wolf attacks and scatters the sheep; this is because he is only a hired man and has no concern for the sheep. I am the good shepherd; I know my own and my own know me, just as the Father knows me and I know the Father; and I lay down my life for my sheep. And there are other sheep I have that are not of this fold, and these I have to lead as well. They too will listen to my voice, and there will be only one flock and one shepherd. The Father loves me, because I lay down my life in order to take it up again. No one takes it from me; I lay it down of my own free will, and as it is in my power to lay it down, so it is in my power to take it up again; and this is the command I have been given by my Father."
