in need. Total Raised: £247.65




## Merit Awards






## **Holy Souls and Remembrance Day**

## Early Years and KS1 Christingle Liturgy Service

Christingle celebrations are named after the Christingles that are lit during the ceremony.

Christingles are oranges wrapped in red tape, decorated with dried fruit or sweets, with a candle on the top. Each element of a Christingle has a special meaning and helps to tell the Christian story:



The orange represents the world. The red ribbon (or tape) symbolises the love and blood of Christ. The sweets and dried fruit represent all of God's creations. The lit candle represents Jesus's light in the world, bringing hope to people living in darkness.

"Jesus, the Light of the World, as we look forward to celebrating your birth, may we begin to see the world in the light of understanding you give us. As you chose the lowly, the outcasts, and the poor to receive the greatest news the world had ever known, so may we worship you in meekness of heart.
