

HISTORY

- A review of Here I Am took place in 2006, highlighting what teachers thought was good and what needed to be improved.
- As a result a working party was put together to create the new scheme Come and See. This was piloted in 2009 and updated according to teachers' recommendations.

Children are especially welcome: Jesus said to his disciples, *'Let the children come to me.'* (Mark 10:14)


 Come and See includes more exciting work and interesting activities to help children to grow in their knowledge and understanding of God and his people.

- There is now a book for each year group, instead of two year groups working on the same objectives.


The three autumn time themes are developed in the light of an understanding of Creation



SPRING


The three spring themes are developed in the light of an understanding of Incarnation

Come and See for yourself

Before each topic begins, there is a time for teachers to come together to prepare for the topic by reflecting on the theme.

There are then three sections to each unit.

- •EXPLORE
- •REVEAL
- •RESPOND

•We also have a time for prayer and reflection within every topic.



This is the introduction to the topic where the children's life experiences are explored, the questions raised are thought about, shared and investigated and their significance is reflected upon. During this section the children will;

- Explore experiences through story, music, drama, dance, art, etc.
- Investigate
- Tell stories
- Consider the big questions
- Discuss

REVEAL

This is the heart of the programme, where knowledge and understanding of the Catholic faith is revealed. This happens through the Word, in Scripture, Tradition, doctrine, prayers, rites and Christian living. During this section the children will;

- Meet new knowledge of religious education
- Develop an understanding of this new knowledge
- Reflect upon the wonder of the mystery
- Gather information
- Research
- Ask questions and discuss answers
- Make links between Christian understanding and life experiences

RESPOND

This is where the learning is reflected upon, celebrated and responded to in daily life. It is made up of three parts Remember, Rejoice and Renew.

During this section the children will;

- Remember what they have learnt
- Celebrate what they have learnt
- Share thoughts and feelings
- Reflect in a quiet prayerful way

OTHER FAITHS

Just as in previous years, we are expected to learn about other faiths.

In the Autumn term we will be covering Judaism and in the Summer Term another religion will be chosen from Hinduism, Islam or Sikhism.

OTHER FAITHS

For other religions there are three sections to be covered

- 1 Look
- 2 Discover
- 3 Respect

PRAYERS

- Prayer is a very important part of our daily life and the Come and See scheme.
- In Early Years, KS1 and KS2 there are certain prayers that the children should know and be familiar with. All prayers have now been sent out to all teachers hence all children will now be aware of the different prayers that they should know at various stages in primary school. We as educators should help the children to learn these prayers with the help of parents who can have access to them on the school website. A hard copy should also be sent home with every child - this will take place in May as the next prayers are all about Mary.
